

In the last few months there have been a number of changes in the membership of the Supreme Court of the United States. The picture opposite is very recent and shows the court as now constituted.

THE PRESENT BULLETIN

For the past two years the BULLETIN showing the motion days of the various district courts has been sent out in mimeographed form, but believing it would be more convenient for the use of the bench and bar we have printed this issue.

THANK YOU

We thank each judge and clerk for the splendid coöperation we have received this year.

The reports received following the year ending June 30, 1940, were the first in the history of the Judicial Council which were complete, that is in which each clerk of the district court and each probate judge made his report so that the information furnished could be included in the BULLETIN. This year both judges and clerks not only sent complete, and in most cases accurate reports, but the majority of these reports reached us soon after July 1. In previous years some of the reports were not received until late in August or early in September, with the result that completion of our reports and the printing of the BULLETIN was delayed. The improvement is gratifying to the Council. This year also the district judges, as well as the probate judges and clerks of the district court, were prompt in their examination of summaries sent them so that final summaries might be made. In past years reports or summaries were received so late that at times it was necessary to change reports which had already been set in type, adding not only to the burden of the work but to the cost of printing. This year but few minor changes were made and the report of them reached us early enough that the changes could be made before a copy went to the printer. Our allowance for printing is limited by legislative appropriation, rising costs of printing and material cannot be ignored and the promptness of the reporting officials has assisted us greatly, and that promptness is appreciated.

OTHER COMMENT

In our October BULLETIN, pages 142 to 149, we condensed a good deal of information pertaining to district courts. In the future we want to condense other reports as much as possible without omitting any information of value to the readers of the BULLETIN. In order that we may be more fully advised as to the wisdom of further condensing the reports, the Council will appreciate suggestions from judges, clerks and others interested in the judicial work, as to data that might be of interest which has not been previously shown, or data that is now being printed but which could be either eliminated or condensed. The desire of the Council is to make the reports not only comply with the statutory provisions, but to be as helpful and informational to the bench and bar as is possible.

SUGGESTION

In the past some of the judges and district clerks have asked for blanks months before reports are due from them. They enter cases as they are closed and on July 1 their reports on cases closed are completed, thus saving a good deal of work at the end of the fiscal year. We will be glad to mail blanks to any official who desires to commence work early on his reports.
