Foreword

The Honorable Leo A. McNalley, President of the Kansas Bar Association, has been requested to prepare an article on a subject of his choosing for publication in this issue of the COUNCIL BULLETIN. He has done so, and we believe his article will be of particular interest to attorneys throughout the state. It is entitled "*Clients' Security Funds (Saint or Sinner)*."

Leo A. McNalley was born at Michigan Valley, Osage County, Kansas, the son of Dr. Michael McNalley, who started practicing medicine in Kansas in 1869. He attended grade and high schools at Michigan Valley and Quenemo, Kansas. At an early age he enlisted in the United States Marine Corps and served in France. After his discharge he entered the University of Kansas and received his LL. B. degree in 1925. He is a member of the Phi Kappa social and Phi Delta Phi legal fraternities. He was admitted to the Bar in the States of Kansas and Florida in 1925. He practiced law in Miami Beach in 1926-27.

In 1925 Judge McNalley was married to Janet Simons of Lawrence, and to this union two children were born: Mary Beth (Mrs. Charles L. Medlock), now of Bartlesville, Oklahoma, and Mike (Dr. Michael C. McNalley), now head of the Department of Cardiology at the University of Tennessee Medical School, Memphis, Tennessee.

In 1927 Judge McNalley established his law office in Minneapolis and served as county attorney for ten years and city attorney for twenty-five years. He later established a partnership with Evan Corman. He belongs to the Catholic Church, served as President of the Chamber of Commerce and Lions Club, and also as Commander of the American Legion. He was Chairman of the Republican Committee of Ottawa County, Kansas, for ten years, and was a delegate to the Republican National Convention in 1940.

Judge McNalley is a member of the Kansas State Bar Association, the Northwest Kansas Bar Association, the Saline County Bar Association, and the American Bar Association, serving the latter as a member of the House of Delegates. In 1961 he was appointed Judge of Division No. 2, Thirtieth Judicial District of Kansas, and served as President of the Kansas District Judges Association. In 1963 he moved from Minneapolis to Salina where he now lives. He now belongs to the Rotary Club, and is a member of the advisory board of Marymount College, Salina. After ten years on the Executive Council he is now President of the Bar Association of the State of Kansas.

This issue of the BULLETIN also contains summarized tables showing the volume of work in the Supreme Court, the district courts, probate courts, county and city courts of the state for the year ending June 30, 1968.

Clients' Security Funds (Saint or Sinner)

It is indisputable that the best public relations of the Bar can be established through the attorney-client relationship. According to the Missouri Bar-Pren-Hall (1963) Survey, the average client has a poorer opinion of the legal profession than the layman who has never been represented by a lawyer. Unethical conduct and lack of discipline have been the root of this problem. More important than any other indictment of the profession is that of "common honesty."

Every member of the Bar must have a pride in his profession that transcends any other consideration he will encounter in his daily practice. To meet this challenge twenty-eight states have set up a program denominated "Clients' Security Fund."

The fund is set up by lawyers and they annually pay a fixed amount. Some funds collect five dollars the first five years admitted to the Bar and fifteen dollars thereafter until the fund is large enough to justify a lower fee. In most instances where there is a voluntary Bar this is done by rule of court and administered under its rules. The payment of this amount is a prerequisite to the right to practice.

Security funds had been established in England, Australia, New Zealand, Canada and South Africa long before they made their appearance in the United States. The first funds to appear in the United States were in Illinois and Pennsylvania.

What is the idea? When a member of the legal profession betrays his trust and embezzles his client's money, the organized Bar should recognize some obligation to provide reimbursement of the loss sustained by his victim. The discharge of that obligation should be considered a debt of honor of the profession. Most lawyers in the U. S. A. do now so regard this.

Some lawyers find it difficult to believe that the honest lawyer owes anything to the client of a dishonest lawyer. Taken as an individual matter this argument has strong conviction. On the other hand, lawyers control legal education and admission to the Bar. They are responsible for discipline and disbarment of lawyers. They are responsible for the honor of their profession.

Establishment of such a fund has generally made other members of the Bar more responsible to their obligations. The public reaction to the fund has been highly favorable.

Speaking of honor for the profession it may be shocking for you to know that no insurance company has been found that will write a policy *to cover this loss*.

The funds and claims would be administered by the Bar.

The claims generally are limited to the client-attorney relationship and do not cover a relative, law partner, attorney employer or employee or associate, or acts covered by fiduciary bonds. The loss covered is wrongful appropriation of property or money, or failure to remit the same. It does not cover malpractice, nonfeasance or negligence.

More than one and one-half million dollars are now in these funds throughout the country. The total average loss, for all the years Clients' Security Funds have been in operation in the United States, is slightly above five thousand dollars. Not one of the twenty-eight states or twelve County Bar Associations that have set up such a fund has ever abandoned or discontinued.

Neighboring states of Missouri, Oklahoma, Colorado and New Mexico have funds. The following conclusions are in the report made in the Spring of 1964 by the Junior Bar Conference:

- (a) Clients' security funds are desirable;
- (b) That misappropriations by attorneys in any state are rare;
- (c) That a bar association which voluntarily recognizes a professional debt of honor where there is no conceivable liability on the part of the members of the bar who are not involved in a particular case should do much to dispel public misapprehension about the legal profession; and
- (d) The fact that the clients' security fund movement is entirely inspired by the legal profession itself, there being at this time no public outcry to push it along, should do much to improve the public relations of the profession.

Surely with the improvement in professional responsibility (ethics) and disciplinary procedure we can afford to secure the candlestick maker, widow, custodian, or janitor, and others that deal with our profession.

This matter is now under study by a committee composed of J. Richards Hunter, Hutchinson, Verne Laing, Wichita, and Jack Dalton, Dodge City. They would appreciate your suggestions on this matter.

Summary of the Work of the Supreme Court

The following is a summary of the work of the Supreme Court for the year ending June 30, 1968, and the cases pending July 1, 1968.

The Supreme Court disposed of 319 cases during the year. Included in the total terminated by the Court were 201 appealed civil cases, 77 appealed criminal cases and 41 original cases.

Of the total civil appeals, 136 were affirmed, 41 were reversed, 16 dismissed, 7 affirmed in part and reversed in part, and 1 affirmed as modified.

Of the appealed criminal cases 45 were affirmed, 8 were reversed, 21 dismissed, and 3 affirmed in part and reversed in part.

Judgment was for the plaintiff in 5 original cases and for the defendant in 24 others. The Court dismissed 12 original cases.

The Supreme Court also issued 822 orders prior to final disposition of cases pending during the year and in addition ruled upon 82 post-decision motions.

During the year 18 civil appeals were also docketed in the Supreme Court under Rule No. 6 (*j*). In such cases, 8 applications for intermediate orders were granted, 9 were denied, and 1 was pending at the end of the fiscal year. In 4 cases, the regular appeal was later docketed and in 10 cases the appeal was either pending or terminated in the district court.

There were 8 applications for permission to take interlocutory appeals (Rule 5) filed in the Supreme Court, 7 of which were denied, and 1 was pending at the end of the fiscal year.

Pending in the Supreme Court as of July 1, 1968, were 294 cases, of which 189 were appealed civil cases, 95 appealed criminal cases and 10 original cases. The average number of cases pending on July 1, for the past ten years, is 301.

During the year ending June 30, 1968, opinions were filed in 272 cases terminated by the Court. In 229 cases opinions were filed on or before the first regular opinion day; in 17 cases on or before the second regular opinion day; and in 2 cases on or before the third opinion day. 24 cases were decided on the day they were submitted.

The regular opinion day is ordinarily a month after the case is submitted, more accurately it is the Saturday of the week hearings are had the next month after the case is submitted.

In the 186 appealed civil cases in which opinions were filed within the year ending June 30, 1968, the time between the date the case was docketed in this Court and the date the case was submitted on its merits was as follows: Within three months, 3 cases; in three to four months, 5 cases; in four to six months, 31 cases; in six to eight months, 13 cases; in eight to ten months, 22 cases; in ten to twelve months, 31 cases; and in over twelve months, 81 cases.

In 57 appealed criminal cases in which opinions were filed during the year ending June 30, 1968, the time between the date notice of appeal was filed in this Court and the date the case was submitted on its merits was as follows: Within three months, no cases; in three to four months, no cases; in four to six months, 1 case; in six to eight months, 2 cases; in eight to ten months, 6 cases; in ten to twelve months, 19 cases; and in over twelve months, 29 cases.

In the forty-one years that the Clerk of the Supreme Court has furnished us detailed information of the work of the Supreme Court, it has disposed of 17,339 cases, of which 5,750 were dismissed before submission, and 11,589 were submitted on the merits and written opinions filed.
