






## The New Members of the Judicial Council

In the July issue of the BULLETIN mention was made of changes in the personnel of the Judicial Council, but lack of space prevented publication of portraits of the new members and short sketches of their lives.

Walter G. Thiele, the chairman, was born in Washington county, Kansas. He graduated from the Kansas University Law School in 1910 and entered practice at Lawrence with the late Judge John Q. A. Norton. He served the city of Lawrence as city attorney, and represented many public bodies and boards while carrying on the private practice of law. He was elected to the supreme court in 1932, took office in 1933, and is still serving.

Randal C. Harvey, the secretary, was born in Shawnee county, Kansas. He attended the Kansas University Law School, entering the United States Army before completing his work there. He was admitted to the Bar in 1919, being associated part of the time with his father, the late Col. A. M. Harvey, of Topeka. He served as attorney for the former Court of Industrial Relations and later as city attorney of Topeka. He is now engaged in private practice in Topeka, with his brother.

James E. Taylor, the third new member, was born in Wallace county, Kansas. He was graduated from the Kansas University Law School in 1926, and entered the practice of law in Wallace county. He has served as county attorney, as city attorney of Sharon Springs, and has been engaged in many civic activities in his home community. He is now in active practice at Sharon Springs.

### What Do You Suggest?

On page 29 of the July BULLETIN is a statement of the proposed work of the Judicial Council. The Council would appreciate the suggestions of anyone interested on the question whether those portions of the crimes act dealing with homicides and assaults should be restated in such manner as to obviate some of the difficulties, under the present statutes, confronting trial courts in instructing the jury.

It has also been proposed that a study be made of the code provisions with reference to the rights of occupying claimants to develop a simpler procedure looking to their protection; also, that consideration be given to amending the code so as to require more explicit pleadings in ejectment and other types of action where any defense may be proved under a general denial.

The request is here repeated that you give the above matters some thought and advise the Council of your conclusions.

### The Lawyer's True Place in the Administration of Justice

In the present state of our affairs, it seems well to again review some of the fundamentals of the administration of justice in the United States. While the crisis which now confronts us involves great and complex dangers from without, it also carries a very serious menace from within. The force of any blow which we strike or any movement which we undertake will depend almost entirely upon the unity and the morale of our people. This makes it imperative that every possible precaution must be taken which will give assurance that justice shall be fairly and efficiently administered. Justice and freedom constitute the very foundation of our scheme of government. Under it, the lives and property of all of us are regulated by laws which we ourselves, through our chosen representatives, have formulated. These laws really constitute a set of rules which we have made, by which we have agreed not to trample on the rights of each other. The administration of these laws is left to the courts. We depend upon the courts to interpret and administer them in such way that each citizen must be afforded his just rights. And whenever any one of them reaches the conclusion that these laws are being improperly and unfairly administered, we are likely to see him develop into a menace to our institutions and an inefficient unit in the march of American achievement.

In the preamble of the canons of professional ethics of the American Bar Association is the statement: "The future of the republic, to a great extent, depends upon our maintenance of justice, pure and unsullied. It cannot be maintained unless the conduct and the motives of the members of our profession are such as to merit the approval of all just men."

Therefore, it behooves us at this time to make a careful examination to detect any weakness or any omission which now may exist in this important branch. And since the lawyer is a component part of and is directly engaged in the execution of this function, it is the purpose of the writer to discuss his duties and his rights and also to attempt to provoke some thoughts as to how he may, with the help he deserves, better assist in the improvement of the administration of justice.

First of all, the lawyer is an officer of the court. It is true that he does not hold public office in the strict sense of the word, yet he really has many public duties to perform. He is just as much a part of the administration of justice as the judge who sits on the bench, the jury who hears the evidence or the bailiff who maintains order in the courtroom. He practices his profession through a license or grant of authority from the state, which may be secured only upon strict proof that he is fully qualified by education, training and moral character. He does not hold this office for any specific length of time, but for life, and cannot be removed except by his own act or by disbarment after a lawful hearing upon serious charges. He is subject at all times to discipline by the court. He is the one person who has the right to appear in court and represent others who are unqualified to represent themselves. And the lawyer is not only authorized to appear in behalf of his clients, but may also appear as a friend of the court and present his views in the interest of promoting justice. It is often true that the opinion of a court is really in a large degree the adaptation of the contentions and arguments presented by one or more lawyers in the case appearing either in behalf of clients or as friends of the court.

Consequently, it seems to the writer that the importance of the work of a lawyer in the administration of justice should receive full understanding and recognition by the public and the courts at all times. He is really the contact man who deals first hand in the problems and controversies of America. If he is not sufficiently skilled, if he does not possess industry, if he is without proper morals or conscience, or if he is restricted in his field by unjust criticism or improper recognition and assistance, it is quite easy for him to produce a discontented citizen.

It is for these reasons that men are carefully scrutinized before they are admitted to the Bar and carefully supervised and disciplined after their admission. There is no doubt in the mind of the writer that the lawyer is not receiving proper understanding and recognition by the public—in some instances by the courts. There is a tendency to regard him as being more of a commercial and business instrumentality than as an officer of the court. There has been an undeserved decline in his prestige. This situation has been brought about through a number of causes, but the greatest of all, perhaps, is the fact that the lawyer is merely the mouthpiece of his client. He must, therefore, appear publicly as a very partisan spokesman, and his words and actions are frequently attributed to him, when in truth they should be charged

to his client. Also, "One wonders," as Mr. Justice Cardozo once stated, "how many are judging us, not by our best, but by our worst and are visiting upon one and all the scorn and condemnation which should be the portion of the few—the fashion is in these times to dwell upon the shortcomings of the Bar and to touch lightly on its virtues."

Unfortunately, the lawyers are largely responsible for this condition. It is frequently said that a lawyer properly handles the business of all other people except that of himself. The various Bar organizations and other legal fraternities have rendered great public service in assisting the lawmaking bodies of the country in wise legislation and in self-discipline, but have too often overlooked the fact that they should not allow the public to forget many things which should be constantly remembered as to the duties and high responsibilities which they bear in the administration of justice. And by the administration of justice is not necessarily meant actual litigation which develops in the courts. We should also remember that perhaps only one controversy out of ten ever develops into litigation and the rest are settled in lawyers' offices. As to whether or not they are settled satisfactorily depends almost entirely upon the ability of the lawyer and the confidence and respect he commands.

Also, as Simeon Baldwin, eminent Connecticut jurist, statesman and teacher, has said, "The uses and opportunities of the legal profession are not to be measured by what it does actively so much as by what it does passively and unobserved. It assures the people that an agency of public character exists which is always near at hand and ready to assure a public remedy for any private wrongs. If, in a country like ours, there were no lawyers, there would be no safety for business enterprise, and little personal security. In these directions, every lawyer is worth ten policemen. He exists to protect the social order. His usefulness to the community, therefore, reaches far beyond the particular sphere of his professional efforts. It lies, primarily, if not mainly, in his being one of a class always standing ready to serve the public in securing the benefits of living under the rule of law."

It seems to the writer that the failure of the Bar to cultivate public knowledge and recognition of the true functions of a lawyer constitutes an important omission in the carrying out of the duties of the profession. In fact, such failure is really a disservice to the community. Amidst the perils which now confront us, there is an urgent need of doing everything possible to bring the Bar to the highest sort of efficiency and standing, and to convince the entire country that every lawyer in it is ready and able to fight to the last for justice among our citizens.

The Code of Justinian, Lib. II, Tit. 7, states: "Advocates who decide the doubtful fates of causes and by the strength of their defense often set up again that which had fallen, and restore that which was weakened, whether in public or in private concerns, protect mankind not less than if they saved country and home by battle and by wounds. For in our warlike empire, we confide not in those alone who contend with swords, shields and breastplates, but in advocates also, for those who manage others' causes fight as, confident in the strength of glorious eloquence, they defend the hope and life and children of those in peril."

Possibly some other causes for the conditions here described are the following:

1. Unfavorable newspaper publicity written by laymen without understanding or appreciation of the subject matter.
2. A growth of the practice of law by laymen before various boards and commissions operating as judicial or quasi judicial bodies.
3. Failure of the lawyers to join Bar Associations set up largely for their benefit.
4. Failure of courts, in many instances, to recognize in their opinions or discussions serious contentions presented by lawyers on one side of the case or on the other.
5. The necessity of lawyers being burdened under our law with the task of preventing the unauthorized practice of law by laymen.
6. Greed of certain business interests resulting in short cuts to decisions of controversies through lay boards of their own choosing.

These are some of the causes, and many more could be listed.

The Bar Association of the State of Kansas is doing, perhaps, more than its part in the important work of placing the lawyer in his true position in the community. Honorable W. E. Stanley, immediate past president of the Association, in his splendid article in the Kansas JUDICIAL COUNCIL BULLETIN of July, 1940, presented a detailed outline of the work of the Association. It is well to repeat a list of the committees which, as he says, speak for themselves, to wit: Conformity of State and Federal Practice; Amendment of Laws and Uniform State Legislation; Legal Education and Admission to the Bar; American Citizenship; Illegal Practice of the Law; Integration of the Bar; Selection of Judges; Public Relations; Criminal Law and Law Enforcement; Corporation Code; Probate Code; Taxaton; Annotations and Restatement; Professional Ethics; Administrative Law and Judicial Administration. It will be seen that the work of these committees is planned along lines to bring about progressive and conservative improvement in the administration of justice and in the public relations of the Bar. And one of the most important committees of the Association is the committee on Legal Institutes. This committee, under the leadership of Mr. John H. Hunt of Topeka, has enlisted a group of leading lawyers located throughout the state who address group meetings of the Bar in various sections on special subjects, to the end of providing advanced legal education on timely subjects. The institutes have been a great success. They have improved the social life of the Bar, they have attracted wide public attention and have impressed the public with the serious aims of the legal profession. In many instances, there has been a large lay attendance at the meetings.

Another important contribution made by the Association to this movement lies in the work of the Radio Committee, under the chairmanship of Mr. Orlin Weede. Under this program, many broadcasts have been made over the Kansas networks and other stations, including round-table discussions and addresses on legal subjects of particular interest at this time. Another committee which has been recently set up, under the chairmanship of Mr. Claude I. Depew, and is now functioning is the Medico-legal committee, consisting of a membership composed of both doctors and lawyers. This committee has under consideration the many problems arising in cases requiring medical testimony.

In view of the present emergency, a committee on National Defense, under the co-chairmanship of Harry Colmery and Everett Steerman has been set up

with a membership covering nearly every community in the state. This committee, under its able leadership, is ready to place the entire membership of the Association behind every movement which will be helpful to national defense, and this committee, of course, is in active coöperation with a similar committee of national scope set up by the American Bar Association.

In addition to the work of the committees of the Association, the matter of advanced legal education is also promoted by the activities of the various sections of the Association which function before and during the annual meeting. These sections operate under the supervision of specialists in certain important branches of the law and permit an exchange of views and discussions of legal questions, frequently puzzling to the general practitioner.

Thus, it is felt that the Bar Association of the State of Kansas is more than doing its part in the matter of placing the lawyer in his true place through its public spirited work in developing legislation to promote the better administration of justice; in the matter of promoting high standards for admission to the Bar; of advanced legal education; of public relations through the radio and legal institutes; of efficient coöperation in the matter of national defense; and in many other unselfish activities. It is safe to say that Kansas has one of the greatest voluntary state Bar Associations in the United States, but it is to be regretted that the recommendations of the Association for the integration of the Bar have not been successfully carried out. It is the belief of the writer that if the lawyers of Kansas would coöperate under a proper system of integration, we would have one of the strongest forces for public good in the state. The American Bar Association is a good example of the tremendous force and influence for good which may be exerted by a large body of lawyers. This Association is recognized as one of the greatest molders of public opinion ever known in this country and its influence is increasing because of the wise, conservative policies which have been pursued over a period of a great many years. And this Association is also doing its part in the matter of promoting better recognition and appreciation of the work and of the importance of the lawyers of America.

We must always expect that lawyers will be criticized and condemned and that there will always be a wide misunderstanding as to their functions, character and motives, but if we will all keep in mind the important service the lawyer renders and the important responsibility he is required to bear, we will never hesitate to help him in public esteem. It may be difficult to entirely break down the natural prejudice which exists, but it will be very easy to ameliorate it. "There is a vague popular belief," said Abraham Lincoln, "that lawyers are necessarily dishonest. I say 'vague' because when we consider to what extent confidence and honor are reposed in and conferred upon lawyers by the people, it appears improbable that their impression of dishonesty is very distinct and vivid." Let us give the lawyer his true place in the administration of justice.

The Judicial Council can add another glorious page to its splendid record of service by making a proper survey and recommendations on this subject. The opinion of DeTocqueville was uncannily accurate when he declared, "I cannot believe that a republic can subsist if the influence of the lawyers in the public business does not increase in proportion to the power of the people."

## Summary of the Work of the Supreme Court

The following is a summary of the work of the supreme court for the year ending June 30, 1941, and of cases pending July 1, 1941:

There were 314 appealed civil cases disposed of within the year ending June 30, 1941. Of these, 103 were dismissed without having been presented on the merits and 211 were submitted on the merits and written opinions filed. Of these cases, 136 were affirmed, 62 reversed, 1 modified, 4 affirmed in part and reversed in part, and 8 were dismissed.

The court also disposed of 31 appealed criminal cases. Of this number, 14 were dismissed without having been presented on the merits and 17 were submitted on the merits and written opinions filed. Of this number, 11 were affirmed, 5 reversed and 1 denied.

The court also disposed of 64 original cases. Of this number, 39 were dismissed before having been presented on the merits; 25 were submitted on the merits and written opinions filed, resulting in judgment for plaintiff in 5 cases and for defendants in 20 cases.

This makes a total of 409 cases disposed of by the supreme court, of which 156 were dismissed without having been presented on the merits, and 253 were submitted on the merits and written opinions filed.

The cases pending July 1, 1941, were as follows: 126 appealed civil cases, 7 appealed criminal cases and 11 original cases, making a total of 144 cases.

Of the 253 cases submitted to the supreme court on the merits and in which written opinions were filed, in 22 cases the opinions were filed before the first regular opinion day, in 170 cases on the first regular opinion day, in 38 cases on the second regular opinion day, in 14 cases on the third regular opinion day, in 6 cases on the fourth regular opinion day and in 3 cases on the fifth regular opinion day. The regular opinion day ordinarily is a month after the case is submitted; more accurately it is the Saturday of the week hearings are had the next month after the case is submitted.

In the appealed civil cases disposed of within the year ending June 30, 1941, and pending on that date, the time between the date of judgment appealed from and the date notice of appeal was filed in the trial court is as follows: Within 10 days, 60 cases; in 10 to 30 days, 110 cases; in 1 to 2 months, 192 cases; in 2 to 3 months, 28 cases; in 3 to 4 months, 16 cases; in 4 to 5 months, 6 cases; in 5 to 6 months, 6 cases; over 6 months, 10 cases; time not stated, 12 cases.

In the appealed civil cases disposed of within the year ending June 30, 1941, and pending on that date, the time between the date notice of appeal was filed in the trial court and the date notice of appeal was filed in the supreme court is as follows: Within 5 days, 212 cases; within 5 to 10 days, 89 cases; within 10 to 20 days, 76 cases; within 20 to 30 days, 20 cases; within 1 to 2 months, 21 cases; within 2 to 3 months, 5 cases; within 3 to 4 months, 2 cases; within 4 to 5 months, 4 cases; time not stated, 11 cases.

In the appealed civil cases disposed of within the year ending June 30, 1941, and pending on that date, the time between the date notice of appeal was filed in the supreme court and the date deposit for costs was made is as follows: Within 5 days, 98 cases; within 5 to 15 days, 83 cases; in 15 to 30 days, 115 cases; in 1 to 2 months, 42 cases; in 2 to 3 months, 4 cases; no deposits made, 98 cases.

In the appealed civil cases in which opinions were filed within the year

ending June 30, 1941, the time between the date notice of appeal was filed in this court and the date the case was submitted on its merits is as follows: Within 3 months, 24 cases; in 3 to 4 months, 57 cases; in 4 to 5 months, 37 cases; in 5 to 6 months, 41 cases; in 6 to 7 months, 23 cases; in 7 to 8 months, 11 cases; in 8 to 9 months, 5 cases; in 9 months to 1 year, 12 cases; and later than 15 months, 1 case.

In the appealed criminal cases disposed of within the year ending June 30, 1941, and pending on that date, the time between the date of judgment appealed from and the date notice of appeal was filed in the trial court is as follows: On the same day, 3 cases; not the same day but within 5 days, 10 cases; from 5 to 10 days, 4 cases; from 10 to 20 days, 3 cases; from 20 to 30 days, 5 cases; from 1 to 2 months, 2 cases; from 4 to 5 months, 2 cases; time not given, 2 cases.

In the appealed criminal cases disposed of by the supreme court within the year ending June 30, 1941, and pending on that date, the time between the date the notice of appeal was filed in the trial court and the date it was filed in the supreme court is as follows: Within 5 days, 17 cases; in 5 to 10 days, 6 cases; in 10 to 30 days, 4 cases; in 1 to 2 months, 2 cases; time not given, 2 cases.

In the appealed criminal cases disposed of within the year ending June 30, 1941, and pending on that date, the time between the date the notice of appeal was filed in the supreme court and the date the deposit for costs was made is as follows: Within 5 days, 4 cases; in 5 to 15 days, 4 cases; in 15 to 30 days, 5 cases; in 1 to 2 months, 7 cases; time not stated, 11 cases.

In the appealed criminal cases in which opinions were filed within the year ending June 30, 1941, the time between the date the notice of appeal was filed in the supreme court and the date the case was submitted on its merits is as following: Within 3 months, 3 cases; in 3 to 4 months, 4 cases; in 4 to 5 months, 2 cases; in 5 to 6 months, 1 case; in 6 to 7 months, 5 cases; and in 7 to 9 months, 2 cases.

In the appealed civil cases disposed of within the year ending June 30, 1941, the costs in 309 cases reported on are as follows: Minimum amount, \$3.45; maximum, \$47.65; aggregate, \$3,858.56; average, \$12.49.

In the appealed criminal cases disposed of within the year ending June 30, 1941, the costs in 29 cases reported on are as follows: Minimum amount, \$5; maximum, \$25; aggregate, \$361.30; and average, \$12.46.

In the original cases disposed of within the year ending June 30, 1941, the costs in 20 cases reported on are as follows: Minimum, \$1.95; maximum, \$39.25; aggregate, \$240.30; and average, \$12.02.

In the year ending June 30, 1941, the court disposed of 578 motions, of which 16 were withdrawn or not presented; 344 were allowed, 178 denied, and 1 allowed in part and denied in part. There were 39 motions pending on July 1, 1941.

There were pending in the supreme court July 1, 1941, a total of 144 cases, compared with 192 cases on the same date in 1940, 249 in 1939, 244 in 1938, 210 in 1937, 268 in 1936, 291 in 1935, 366 in 1934, 333 in 1933, 357 in 1932, 393 in 1931, 397 in 1930, 376 in 1929 and 341 in 1928.

In the 14 years the clerk of the supreme court has furnished us detailed information of the work of that court, it has disposed of 7,645 cases, of which 2,468 were dismissed before final submission, and 5,177 were submitted on the merits and written opinions filed.
