FOREWORD

Since July 1, 1945, the work of the Judicial Council has been limited to the collection of statistics with reference to the courts, and to the preparation of the summaries printed in this issue. The Council is pleased to note that co-operation of the clerks of the various courts and of the probate judges is increasingly effective, and compared to past years, the reports reaching the Council have been more thoroughly and promptly prepared.

The Comment on Statistical Tables, printed herein, was prepared by Randal C. Harvey, Secretary of the Council.

The 1945 Session Laws have been in the hands of the bench and bar since about July 1, 1945. Now that opportunity for examination has been had, the Council will appreciate having the views of anyone, pertaining to proposed legislation for the improvement of our judicial processes.

COMMENT ON STATISTICAL TABLES

Our statistical tables for the year ending June 30, 1945, show signs of emergence from the wartime slump in litigation, particularly in the district courts.

BUSINESS OF THE DISTRICT COURTS

During the current statistical year, 16,330 civil cases were commenced in the district courts, and 16,152 were disposed of, compared to 14,298 last year, and 12,940 for the year ended June 30, 1943. Much of this increase is accounted for by divorce cases which are still growing in number, but there is also an increase in other types of business. Civil cases other than divorce increased from 6,603 in the statistical year 1944 to 7,222 in 1945; while divorce cases increased from 7,695 to 8,930. Contested cases also increased from 2,267 to 2,475, but civil jury trials dropped from 129 to 106. Motions and demurrers declined from 11,633 to 10,956, which is still an adequate number. There were 162 appeals to the Supreme Court, compared to 145 in the previous year. 77 percent of the contested cases were tried within six months from filing, compared with 75 percent the year before.

There were 1,564 criminal cases disposed of during the year, almost exactly the same as the year before. However, there were twice as many criminal trials, 262 as compared with 130. 82 percent of the criminal trials were held within six months after filing. 17 criminal cases were appealed to the Supreme Court, while only 11 were appealed the previous year.

While the number of divorce cases increased from 7,695 to 8,930 (an increase of 1,245), the number of divorces granted was only 6,006 as compared to 5,577 in the previous year (an increase of 429 or about 7½ percent). Divorces were denied in 43 cases. The remainder of the divorce cases are accounted for by 2,854 dismissals, compared with 2,089 in the previous year. This may show some tendency toward reconciliation in a moderate percentage of the cases, which are often hastily filed in these days of domestic stress. Emergencies were declared in only 790 cases, compared with 852 the previous year.

No detailed analysis has been made of personal injury or foreclosure cases which formed such a large part of district court litigation in prewar years, but a casual examination of the reports in our office shows that the former were greatly reduced in number and the latter were almost nonexistent during the past year. Both may be expected to resume their normal proportions during the postwar period, with consequent increase in the work of the courts. It is possible that the same will be true of criminal cases. With the return of this business, plus the normal increase which is already manifesting itself, it is probable that the district courts, with few exceptions, will have an abundance of business to handle during the next few years. The legislature of 1945 showed commendable foresight in not undertaking a general judicial reapportionment during this abnormal period.

BUSINESS OF THE PROBATE COURTS

The aggregate business of the probate courts, during the year ending June 30, 1945, was about the same as during the previous year. There was a decline

in number of estates opened, juvenile cases, insanity hearings and orders made in district court cases by the probate judge. There was an increase in new guardianships, foreign transcripts filed, trusts under supervision, adoption proceedings, habeas corpus cases, and proceedings for the determination of descent. The increase in descent proceedings has been continuous since the adoption of the Probate Code, as shown by the following totals of estates opened and proceedings for determination of descent, since 1938:

* The number of estates opened was not computed prior to 1942, but since that date has varied less than ten percent from the number closed. It appears clearly that although the number of descent proceedings has increased consistently since 1939, there has been no decline (nor substantial increase) in the number of estates in which full administration was had.

The business of the probate courts is being disposed of in about the same time as in the preceding year. 61 percent of estates were closed within 15 months after filing, and 59 percent of the pending estates have been in court less than one year. This is about 2 percent better than in the year ended June 30, 1944. Inventories or accounts were filed in 76 percent of the estates and 54 percent of the guardianships, and accounts were filed in 59 percent of the trusts under supervision, a slight decline in each class of about 2 percent. No reports of marriages or marriage licenses were requested this year, since this information is compiled by the Vital Statistics branch of the State Board of Health.

COUNTY COURTS

Civil cases in county courts increased from 678 to 766, and criminal cases declined from 1,525 to 1,506. The general types of cases and manner of disposition averaged about the same. New county courts have been created in Douglas, Comanche, and Rooks counties, and we have our first report from those courts, making a total of 46 county courts in operation.

CITY COURTS

There was a sharp decline in the number of civil cases in the city courts, from 7,904 to 5,341. Criminal cases show a lesser decrease, from 2,584 to 2,489. There was also a decline in the number of garnishments from 4,363 to 2,357, and in executions from 1,847 to 863, and in replevin actions from 442 to 251. These figures reflect the continuance of wartime employment conditions, coupled with government regulations against installment purchases. In the early years of the war many old debts and judgments were collected through provisional remedies in the city courts, but this phase of litigation has now fallen off. Forceable detainer actions reached the low figure of 646, compared with 668 in the previous year, both years being affected by government rent control regulations, as well as by good employment conditions.

SUMMARY OF THE WORK OF THE SUPREME COURT

The following is a summary of the work of the supreme court for the year ended June 30, 1945, and of cases pending July 1, 1945.

There were 186 appealed civil cases disposed of within the year ended June 30, 1945. Of these, 51 were dismissed without having been presented on the merits and 135 were submitted on the merits and written opinions filed. Of these cases, 87 were affirmed, 32 reversed, 5 affirmed in part and reversed in part, 1 affirmed in part and modified in part, 3 denied, and 7 were dismissed.

The court also disposed of 9 appealed criminal cases. Of this number 8 were dismissed without having been presented on the merits and 1 was submitted on the merits and written opinion of affirmance filed.

The court also disposed of 15 original cases. Of this number, 6 were dismissed before having been presented on the merits, and 9 cases were submitted on the merits and written opinions filed, resulting in judgment for plaintiff in 2 cases and for defendant in 7 cases.

This makes a total of 210 cases disposed of by the supreme court, of which 65 were dismissed without having been presented on the merits and 145 were submitted on the merits and written opinions filed.

The cases pending July 1, 1945, were as follows: 93 appealed civil cases, 15 appealed criminal cases, and 15 original cases, making a total of 123 cases.

Of the 145 cases submitted to the supreme court on the merits and in which written opinions were filed, in 9 cases the opinions were filed before the first regular opinion day, in 110 cases on the first regular opinion day, in 25 cases on the second regular opinion day, and in 1 case on the fourth regular opinion day. The regular opinion day ordinarily is a month after the case is submitted; more accurately it is the Saturday of the week hearings are had the next month after the case is submitted.

In the 135 appealed civil cases in which opinions were filed within the year ended June 30, 1945, the time between the date notice of appeal was filed in this court and the date the case was submitted on its merits is as follows: Within 3 months, 35 cases; in 3 to 4 months, 23 cases; in 4 to 5 months, 18 cases; in 5 to 6 months, 16 cases; in 6 to 7 months, 13 cases; in 7 to 8 months, 16 cases; in 8 to 9 months, 2 cases; in 9 to 12 months, 10 cases; and over 12 months, 2 cases.

In the 1 appealed criminal case in which opinion was filed within the year ended June 30, 1945, the time between the date the notice of appeal was filed in the supreme court and the date the case was submitted on its merits was within 4 to 5 months.

In the year ended June 30, 1945, the court disposed of 379 motions, of which 360, or 95 percent, were disposed of in 30 days; average time, 7 days.

There was pending in the supreme court July 1, 1945, a total of 123 cases compared with 99 cases on the same date in 1944, 109 in 1943, 175 in 1942, 144 in 1941, 192 in 1940, 249 in 1939, 244 in 1938, 210 in 1937, 268 in 1936, 291 in 1935, 366 in 1934, 333 in 1933, 357 in 1932, 393 in 1931, 397 in 1930, 376 in 1929, and 341 in 1928.

In the 18 years the clerk of the supreme court has furnished us detailed information of the work of that court, it has disposed of 8,800 cases, of which 2,799 were dismissed before final submission, and 6,001 were submitted on the merits and written opinions filed.
