FOREWORD

Following our customary practice, we have asked the Honorable O. B. Eidson, president of the Bar Association of the State of Kansas, whose photograph is shown on the cover, to prepare an article on a subject of his own choosing for publication in this issue of the **BULLETIN**.

Mr. Eidson was born at Reading, Kansas, on June 14, 1890, and is a graduate of Topeka High School and the Washburn University School of Law. He was admitted to the Kansas bar in 1915, and has practiced law continuously in Topeka since that time. He is a member of the law firm of Lillard, Eidson, Lewis & Porter, with offices in the New England Building, Topeka. He and his wife Agnes are the parents of three daughters and one son. He is a past president of the Topeka Bar Association and has been a member of the executive council of the Bar Association of the State of Kansas since 1944. This past summer he attended the convention of the American Bar Association in New York and London, following which he and Mrs. Eidson toured parts of Europe. We feel that his article will be of interest to our readers.

In January of this year William M. Mills, Jr., of Topeka, who has been a member of and secretary of the Judicial Council since 1953, submitted his resignation due to the fact that he had retired from the active practice of law to assume the position of a vice-president and trust officer of the Merchants National Bank, Topeka. Chief Justice Jay S. Parker appointed former Chief Justice Walter G. Thiele, who retired from the Supreme Court on January 14th, to succeed Mr. Mills. Members of the Council elected Judge Thiele, who formerly served as chairman from 1941 to 1953, as secretary.

One other change in the membership of the Council occurred when Max L. Dice, of Johnson, succeeded John H. Murray, of Leavenworth, as chairman of the House Judiciary Committee, and Mr. Dice is now serving.

This issue of the **BULLETIN** also contains summarized tables showing the volume of work in the Supreme Court, the district courts, probate courts, county courts and city courts of the state for the year ending June 30, 1957. The Judicial Council requests your study of the statistical information shown in the tables and invites suggestions as to any improvements that could be made in the form and content of the information collected.

Comments on the 1957 New York and London Meetings of the American Bar Association

In the humble judgment of the writer of this brief article the 80th Annual Meeting of the American Bar Association in New York and in London was the culmination of probably the most successful year in the history of the organization, in its very earnest and intensive efforts to improve the administration of justice and to bring the practice of law up to the highest possible peak of integrity and efficiency for service to our Nation, State and to our clients.

Most of you will remember the remarks of the dynamic President of the American Bar Association, David F. Maxwell, at our annual meeting at Wichita last May when he said concerning our National Bar Association:

"We haven't stopped our work in the public interest, we haven't stopped our work on the research side, but I think it's time that we began to do something for the lawyers as well as for the public and others. Because I believe that the lawyers are the bulwark of this Nation against communism, that is the first line of defense to protect the liberties of the people, that the lawyers are by training and experience best qualified to go into the Congress and the legislative halls to protect the rights of the people. Therefore I say that we ought to keep the lawyers strong economically and politically independent, and that is part of our program this year."

That, gentlemen of the Kansas Bar, is not only the national program, but it is the goal of your own state and local Bar Associations. It is, of course, fundamental that when we, as lawyers, bend our best efforts to improve the administration of justice and, if we achieve any measure of success in that respect, we are automatically improving our own status and that of the Bar as a whole.

Sitting as a member of the House of Delegates in the meetings of the American Bar Association both at the New York sessions and at London it was an inspiration to review the extremely well written reports and recommendations of the many sections. These evidenced the effective work of a host of lawyers who had spent endless hours in study, debate and consideration of the many matters that not only affect our profession but also our very way of life. Some of the reports presented to and acted upon by the House of Delegates at New York were: Trial by Jury, involving an amendment to the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure in certain cases; United States Membership in the Organization for Trade Co-operation; Divorce and Marriage Laws and Family Courts; Canons of Ethics; Taxation; The Federal Budget; Congressional Witnesses; Uniform State Laws, and last, the subject of Judicial Candidates. This final subject involved a resolution calling for the creation of an independent commission to aid the President in screening candidates for Federal Judgeships to take their selection "out of the area of political patronage."

In London the House of Delegates considered a very vigorous report on Communist Tactics, Strategy and Objectives. This report dealt strongly with

the necessity for new legislation to safeguard the confidential nature of F. B. I. files; the giving back to Congressional Committees their old freedom of investigation; to correct the view that the Smith Act was not intended to prohibit the advocacy of forcible overthrow of our government; and finally to procure new legislation that would permit schools, bar associations, and other organizations to set standards of membership to exclude those who refuse to testify frankly about their past Communist activities. This last report received wide publicity in the Press both in England, Paris and in America. It was interesting to note that it was made notwithstanding the frequent pronouncements of various speakers at the meetings to the effect that the sanctity of our Supreme Court decisions must remain unimpaired. However, when careful thinking is given, there is no great inconsistency. There were many other reports made at the three full morning sessions of the House of Delegates meetings in London.

The foregoing is only given to show, in a limited way, the vast and far reaching efforts and labors of your American Bar Association, generally, and particularly at these last meetings.

At the conclusion of the London meeting the newly selected President of the American Bar Association, Charles S. Rhyne, announced his hopes and aspirations for the work of the association during the coming year. One of the six points he stressed was for the creation of "legal machinery to achieve peace under law." This, from the very beginning of that meeting, had been continually emphasized, starting with the opening assembly in ancient Westminster Hall with all of the pomp and drama of the British Judiciary adorned with their brilliant robes and wigs. At that meeting Attorney General Brownell outlined a practical plan for international law for the establishment of judicial tribunals having compulsory jurisdiction over international disputes. He urged the lawyers of his audience and of the world to accept the challenge of perfecting legal machinery for international settlements. He said that nations as well as individuals must be subject to justice under law. He pointed out that if this was not soon accomplished there would only be the terrible alternative of nuclear war. While this was perhaps the outstanding theme of the meeting with our British brothers, the cordiality of the hosts and the gratitude of the guests did much to bring about a deep feeling of friendliness and of co-operative efforts in the pursuit of the administration of justice and of law generally. There were many meetings where a comparison was made between the respective methods of each nation in its legal problems and where each were fully discussed.

The last gathering of American lawyers in London to meet with the British Bar was in 1924 and it was the consensus of those in attendance and of the press that the renewal of such a friendly conference at this time was well worth the great effort and expense that contributed to its most successful conclusion. I am sure you will all want to read your American Bar News, your American Bar Association Magazine, and the full written report, particularly of the London portion of the meeting, when it becomes available.

As a postscript or addendum and by way of emphasis to and in confirmation of some of the foregoing statements I think it might be of interest to the lawyers who did not attend the London conference to read the words of welcome given to them on their arrival, by Lord Kilmuir, the Lord High Chancellor,

and by the Lord Mayor of London. These kind words were contained in a beautifully printed booklet, entitled, "Lawyers' London" fully illustrated by a lovely picture of the Queen at the beginning followed by pictures of The New Palace and Westminster Hall, the Law Courts of all of the Inns of Court, and many others. This booklet was given to each registering lawyer in a large envelope which also contained tickets, invitations and programs covering the many, many events which the British Lawyers had so graciously arranged for their guests. The reproduced letter of Lord Kilmuir is as follows:

"HOUSE OF LORDS,
SW. 1.

"It is thirty-three years since the American Bar Association last held its annual Conference in London. These have been momentous years wherein every concept on which we, as lawyers, were nourished has been challenged. These concepts have stood the test, fierce though it has been, and the Rule of Law still flourishes over vast areas of the world.

"Perhaps it is not altogether bad that we should have been compelled to re-examine in such conditions the ideas which we had so long taken for granted. And this re-examination continues.

"It is a source of great pleasure to us that the deliberations of the American Bar Association, one of the greatest communities of lawyers in the world, are to take place this year in London, the home of the Common Law; and members of the profession here look forward eagerly to meeting their American brethren, to forming friendships and exchanging ideas with them. We wish you all success for your Conference; we shall do our best to make you feel at home, and we hope that you will enjoy your stay with us.

"It gives me the greatest pleasure as Chief Magistrate of the City of London and First Commissioner of the Central Criminal Court and, if I may say so, as a Solicitor myself, to welcome most warmly to London the delegates attending the 1957 Convention of the American Bar Association.

"It was a particular and delightful compliment which our American friends paid to us when, having opened this Convention in New York, they then decided to adjourn its further deliberations to London. The interchange of view, of opinion and of discussion, which this meeting in London will afford to lawyers from both sides of the Atlantic can do nothing but good.

"In these times, which have seen the liberty of the individual so grievously assailed and the lamp of freedom verily extinguished in many part of the globe, the role of the lawyer as the humble champion of the rule of law, of justice tempered with mercy, and of decent fair dealing between man and man, is more important than ever before. With all my heart I wish God Speed and good luck to this Convention and to every individual who has the great privilege and, let it never be forgotten, the heavy responsibility of participating in it.

It is suggested that you who were not there, contact your friends who did attend, that you may examine and read this booklet. That is necessary in order to fully understand its beauty and to appreciate the care and effort that went into its preparation.

HOW YOU CAN HELP

From time to time various suggestions are made, usually orally, concerning changes which might be made in the code of civil procedure and in matters generally which the person making the suggestion believes would promote advancement in our judicial processes. The Council will appreciate it very much if you will write it a letter expressing your view not only concerning the subjects later mentioned but also anything which you believe will improve the administration of justice and the advancement of our courts and their procedures.

One of the suggestions made is that the provisions of the code of civil procedure with reference to new trials (G. S. 1949, 60-3001 *et seq.*) be revised to provide that a motion for a new trial should cover not only a re-examination of questions of fact, as it now does, but also of questions of law, arising during the course of a trial; that the time for filing such a motion should be extended to ten days or longer if the trial court, for good cause, shall so order; that the motion shall point out with particularity all matters of which complaint is made, and on appeal no error may be specified for any trial error not included in the motion for a new trial, except by order of the appellate court. And if the statute is amended as above, then that portion of G. S. 1949, 60-3302, *second*, providing for appeal from a ruling on a demurrer should be amended to include only a ruling on a demurrer to a pleading.

Another suggestion is that in view of the extended jurisdiction and power conferred on county courts, city courts, magistrate's courts, and courts of common pleas, the code of civil procedure before justices, which has not been substantially changed since it was originally enacted, should be revised and brought up to date.

A third suggestion pertains to the probate court. Under G. S. 1949, 59-403 provision is made for an allowance to the surviving spouse for his or her benefit and the benefit of the minor children of the deceased during the period of their minority. If there is no surviving spouse the allowance is to the minor children. Reference is made to the statute for specific details. The suggestion for amendment arises from facts of the following general tenor. A father dies leaving a small estate the value of which was about offset by unsecured debts. His property would to a great extent have been included in an allowance had one been made. The father left no surviving spouse and no children except an adult incompetent son who had been dependent upon his father. Under the above statute no allowance could be made to the son. Should the statute be amended to include dependent incompetents in the class entitled to take an allowance?

The last is not a suggestion with reference to our statutes. The judiciary committee of the Legislative Council is giving consideration to the questions of judicial reapportionment and results flowing therefrom, with respects to the district courts. Although there have been sporadic changes from time to time, there has been nothing resembling an over-all apportionment for over sixty years. Originally many districts were bounded so that a territory would be constituted that permitted travel by railroad. These districts were usually one county wide and five or six counties in length. The use of the automobile has made a change in a proper method of fixing the perimeter of a district. And during the course of the years there has been change in various districts; some have increased in population, valuation and other factors much more than others. Will you please examine the statistics in this issue of the BULLETIN, compare the figures with previous years, compare the various districts, bearing in mind the number of counties in each district, its population, valuation and other facts you deem pertinent, and then write us your views? We will submit all replies to the Legislative Council for its study.

Summary of the Work of the Supreme Court

The following is a summary of the work of the Supreme Court for the year ended June 30, 1957, and the cases pending July 1, 1957.

There were 295 appealed civil cases disposed of within the year ended June 30, 1957. Of these, 112 were dismissed without having been presented on the merits and 183 were submitted on the merits. Of these cases 116 were affirmed, 16 were reversed, 18 were affirmed in part and reversed in part, 2 were affirmed in part and modified in part, 2 were dismissed, 6 were reversed in part and remanded in part, 21 were reversed with direction, 2 were denied in part and modified in part, 2 were affirmed in part and reversed with direction, 1 was affirmed in part and dismissed in part, 1 was reversed and clarified, and 1 was affirmed conditionally.

The court disposed of 24 appealed criminal cases. Of this number 7 were dismissed without having been presented on the merits and 17 were submitted on the merits. Of these cases 11 were affirmed, 4 were reversed, and 2 were reversed with directions.

The court also disposed of 27 original cases. Of this number 7 were dismissed without having been presented on the merits, and 20 cases were submitted on the merits and written opinions filed, resulting in judgment for the plaintiff in 2 cases, judgment for the defendant in 15 cases, 2 certificates surrendered, and 1 modified and writ allowed.

This makes a total of 346 cases disposed of by the Supreme Court, of which 126 were dismissed without having been presented on the merits and 220 decided on the merits.

The cases pending July 1, 1957, are as follows: 273 appealed civil cases; 25 appealed criminal cases; and 14 original cases, making a total of 312 cases pending.

Of the 220 cases submitted to the Supreme Court on the merits, in 19 cases the opinions were filed before the regular opinion day, in 134 cases on the first regular opinion day, 59 on the second regular opinion day, 4 on the third regular opinion day, 1 on the fourth regular opinion day, 2 on the sixth regular opinion day, and 1 on the seventh regular opinion day.

The regular opinion day is ordinarily a month after the case is submitted, more accurately it is the Saturday of the week hearings are had the next month after the case is submitted.

In 183 appealed civil cases in which opinions were filed within the year ending June 30, 1957, the time between the date of notice of appeal was filed in this court and the date the case was submitted on its merits is as follows: within 3 months 1 case; in 3 to 4 months 1 case; in 4 to 5 months 7 cases; in 5 to 6 months 7 cases; in 6 to 7 months 7 cases; in 7 to 8 months 16 cases; in 8 to 9 months 40 cases; in 9 to 12 months 90 cases; and over 12 months 14 cases.

In the 17 appealed criminal cases in which opinions were filed within the year ended June 30, 1957, the time between the date of notice of appeal was filed in this court and the date the case was submitted on its merits is as follows: 3 to 4 months 0 cases; in 4 to 5 months 5 cases; in 5 to 6 months 1 case; in 6 to

7 months 2 cases; in 7 to 8 months 1 case; in 8 to 9 months 0 cases; in 9 to 12 months 6 cases; and over 12 months 2 cases.

There were pending in the Supreme Court July 1, 1957, a total of 312 cases as compared to 272 cases on the same date in 1956, 245 on the same date in 1955, 197 cases on the same date in 1954, 192 cases on the same date in 1953, 223 cases on the same date in 1952, 99 cases on the same date in 1951, 189 cases on the same date in 1950, 166 cases in 1949, 109 cases in 1948, 175 cases in 1942, 144 cases in 1941, 192 cases in 1940, 249 cases in 1939, 244 cases in 1938, 210 cases in 1937, 268 cases in 1936, 291 cases in 1935, 366 cases in 1934, 333 cases in 1933, 357 cases in 1932, 393 cases in 1931, 397 cases in 1930, 376 cases in 1929, and 341 cases in 1928.

In the 30 years the clerk of the Supreme Court has furnished us detailed information of the work of the court, it has disposed of 12,870 cases, of which 4,104 were dismissed before submission, and 8,766 were submitted on the merits and written opinions filed.
