Foreword

The Honorable Clayton M. Davis, President of the Bar Association of the State of Kansas, has been requested to prepare an article on the subject of his choosing for publication in this issue of the BULLETIN. He has done so and we believe his article will be of particular interest to attorneys throughout the state. It is entitled "Economics of the Practice of Law."

Clayton M. Davis of Topeka was born in Iola, Kansas, November 18, 1905. He attended Iola elementary school and moved with his parents to Fredonia where he graduated from high school. He spent his college freshman year at Kansas State University in pre-engineering, thereafter worked a year, and re-entered college at Washburn University, sustaining himself working as a chemist for the State Oil Inspector. Having won basketball letters in high school and as a freshman at Kansas State, he also earned four basketball and two track letters at Washburn. He received his law degree from Washburn School of Law and was admitted to practice in June, 1929, starting as a sole practitioner in Wichita. In 1932 he returned to Topeka in association with the firm of Jackson, Smith and Jackson and later with the firm of Smith, Hatcher and McFarland. After a period of service in the office of County Attorney of Shawnee County, he was employed as assistant attorney, then as attorney for Kansas for the Rock Island railroad. He is presently the senior member of the firm of DuMars, Davis, Bennett & Hannah.

He is a member of the Presbyterian Church, Delta Theta Phi legal fraternity, Alpha Delta social fraternity and Sagamore honorary fraternity, has served as president of Topeka Junior Chamber of Commerce, Topeka Provident Association, Topeka Lions Club, Topeka Traffic Club, Topeka Country Club, director of Topeka Chamber of Commerce, and for 12 years served on the Board of Regents of Washburn University. He is a past president of the Topeka Bar Association, served in the House of Delegates of the American Bar Association, and has been on the Executive Council of the Kansas Bar Association since 1956.

He is married to a college classmate, Martha DuMars, and has three children, Mrs. C. P. P. Reid of Chapel Hill, North Carolina; John E. Davis, Topeka; and Mrs. Edwin R. Phelps, III of Hanford, California.

This issue of the BULLETIN also contains summarized tables showing the volume of work in the Supreme Court, the district courts, probate courts, county and city courts of the state for the year ending June 30, 1966.

Economics of the Practice of Law

An invitation to prepare an article for the JUDICIAL COUNCIL BULLETIN, in view of the importance of that publication, is not lightly accepted. When the invitation includes "choose your own subject," the acceptance is more cautious because if the subject matter lacks reader interest, the author cannot use the shield that the subject was thrust upon him.

There are many interesting topics, running the gamut from Legality of the United States Participation in the Viet Nam War to Electronic Data Retrieval.

One of the numerous topics relating to the practice of law being discussed these days is the subject of "Law Practice Economics" and it is receiving added emphasis. Many leaders of the profession are commenting upon the need for increasing the average income of lawyers and the inter-related problems of its effect on the public image of the profession. It is believed that there will be little public esteem for the lawyer who cannot pay his bills or who finds it necessary to handle the affairs of his clients in a slipshod or inattentive manner because of inadequate compensation. Elevation in the average income of the lawyer in the community is required if the lawyer is to gain and hold his position of community leadership. If the lawyer's income is commensurate to his professional status, his stature in the community will correspondingly increase, and the qualities inherent in his legal training for the benefit of his community will be asserted, and he will be recognized and called upon as one of the community leaders. It is, therefore, in the public interest that the legal profession prosper; for, it has been said, that without the lawyer the road to totalitarianism would be smooth indeed. I think it is true that people generally feel that lawyers are a force for good in the community life and they turn to the lawyer for leadership in school, church and community projects. In many instances without compensation the lawyer champions the causes of justice regardless of the odds, the consequences or unsavory situations in both areas of human and property rights. Generally the lawyer is never lacking in courage in attempting to right an injustice. This is preliminary to the theme that a lawyer should prosper in his community.

In order to prosper a lawyer must charge and collect an adequate and reasonable fee for the services performed. The determination of the amount of the fee which is adequate for the services performed and reasonable for the client for whom they are performed can sometimes be as much of a problem as that for which the lawyer's help is sought. The meticulous keeping of time records to form the basis for determining the fee is essential to the improvement of the lawyer's income for it has been demonstrated by studies and surveys that the lawyer who keeps a time record upon which he can base his fee benefits about 25 percent more than the lawyer who does not keep such records. On the average there are approximately 1,300 hours per annum which a lawyer can count as chargeable time for which he can bill his clients. The sole practitioner or groups of practitioners can readily calculate the hourly costs of maintaining and operating his or their office and the cost of producing one hour of chargeable work, and upon such basis determine the hourly charge for his services which is necessary for an adequate net income. Aside from this, the use of a suggested minimum fee schedule is gaining in favor and more and more attention is being given to it throughout the profession.

A suggested or recommended minimum fee schedule for certain types of services is proper and a helpful guideline in determining a charge which is reasonable to the client and adequate for the lawyer, protecting the client.

against unfair or exorbitant fees and at the same time fairly compensating the lawyer for the legal services rendered. A correct understanding of the use and purpose of a suggested minimum fee schedule is important to the public as well as to the Bar. Such a schedule should not be accepted as mandatory or unyielding, but as a criteria by which the specific service involved can be gauged. The promulgation of a suggested minimum fee schedule is consistent with the Canons of Professional Ethics of the American Bar Association. Canon No. 12 (164 Kansas XIV) recites, among other things, that "in fixing fees, lawyers should avoid charges which overestimate their advice and services, as well as those which undervalue them;" and six guidelines are listed in the Canon for determining the amount of the fee. One of these guidelines is "the customary charges of the Bar for similar services." The Canon further provides that in determining such customary charges, it is proper for a lawyer to take into consideration a schedule of minimum fees adopted by a bar association, but he is not to be controlled solely thereby. A wholesome effect of employing the use of a suggested minimum fee schedule, keeping in mind that such a schedule is not a mandatory or hard and fast rule, is the deterrent to fee shopping by prospective clients and the fee cutting by lawyers so inclined, both of which can only result in a detriment to the lawyers and a lessening of the public's regard for the profession. In passing it may also be said that recognition of a duly adopted, suggested minimum fee schedule may guard against a violation of the Canons of Ethics. In a formal opinion of the American Bar Association Ethics Committee, Opinion No. 302, it is pointed out that the effect of *habitual* charging of fees less than those established by a minimum fee schedule, or the charging of such fees without proper justification, *may* be evidence of unethical conduct. Such would not result from the charging of a substandard fee, or no fee at all, in a particular case or under unusual circumstances, but might result where habitual charging of low fees amounts to advertising, solicitation or slip-shod rendered legal service. It is true that a lawyer who charges inadequate fees must necessarily handle more matters in order to receive the same income, and he must spread his work-time thinner as to each matter, thereby inviting situations of laxity or inattention to his clients' affairs.

The adoption of and general adherence to a suggested, not mandatory, minimum fee schedule, whether on a local, district or state level, will not cure all economic problems of the lawyer; but it will help solve them. Studies of the subject recognize there is a variance between different states or regions or between different areas of the same state with respect to proper, specific hourly charges for the same or similar work, which arise from the difference in costs of rendering the services. But it would seem that a "work unit" type of schedule for specific items of service in particular types of cases could be devised for statewide application to which any area then could apply a properly calculated hourly rate, or some other acceptable method. "The establishment of suggested minimum fee schedules by bar associations is a thoroughly laudable activity." (Opinion 302, Ethics Committee of American Bar Association.)

Unless the trend of declining average income of the legal profession in comparison with other professions is reversed, the lawyers will be in no position to discharge adequately the responsibilities of public trust placed in them; and their status as an independent profession can be endangered.

The promulgation of a suggested or recommended, workable, statewide minimum fee schedule is being studied by the Committee on Professional Economics of the Kansas Bar Association. Other states are ahead of Kansas in this field. To ignore the economic facts of the practice of law and ways to improve the economic status of the lawyer in Kansas is to hide our professional heads in the sand. A suggested fee schedule is one step in ascending to the economic level to which the Kansas lawyer should aspire and achieve.

Summary of the Work of the Supreme Court

The following is a summary of the work of the Supreme Court for the year ending June 30, 1966, and the cases pending July 1, 1966.

The Supreme Court disposed of 328 cases during the year. Included in the total terminated by the court were 224 appealed civil cases, 60 appealed criminal cases and 44 original cases.

Of the total civil appeals, 115 were affirmed, 63 were reversed, 36 dismissed, 7 affirmed in part and reversed in part, 1 affirmed as modified and 2 affirmed with directions.

Of the appealed criminal cases 25 were affirmed, 6 were reversed, 28 dismissed, and 1 appeal sustained.

Judgment was for the plaintiff in 2 original cases and for the defendant in 36 others. The court dismissed 6 original cases.

The Supreme Court also issued 567 orders prior to final disposition of cases pending during the year and in addition ruled upon 97 post-decision motions.

During the year 21 civil appeals were also docketed in the Supreme Court under Rule No. 6 (j). In such cases, 8 applications for intermediate orders were granted; 13 were denied. In 9 cases, the regular appeal was later docketed and in 12 cases the appeal was either pending or terminated in the district court.

There were 9 applications for permission to take interlocutory appeals (Rule 5) filed in the Supreme Court, 7 of which were denied, 1 was withdrawn and 1 was pending at the end of the fiscal year.

Pending in the Supreme Court as of July 1, 1966, were 291 cases, of which 164 were appealed civil cases, 105 appealed criminal cases and 22 original cases. The average number of cases pending on July 1, for the past ten years, is 302.

During the year ending June 30, 1966, opinions were filed in 267 cases terminated by the Court. In 198 cases opinions were filed on or before the first regular opinion day; in 12 cases on or before the second regular opinion day; in 11 cases on or before the third regular opinion day; in 7 cases on or before the fourth regular opinion day; and in 2 cases after the fourth regular opinion day. 37 cases were decided on the day they were submitted.

The regular opinion day is ordinarily a month after the case is submitted, more accurately it is the Saturday of the week hearings are had the next month after the case is submitted.

In the 195 appealed civil cases in which opinions were filed within the year ending June 30, 1966, the time between the date the case was docketed in this Court and the date the case was submitted on its merits was as follows: Within three months, 8 cases; in three to four months, 13 cases; in four to six months, 42 cases; in six to eight months, 69 cases; in eight to ten months, 40 cases; in ten to twelve months, 11 cases; and in over twelve months, 12 cases.

In 34 appealed criminal cases in which opinions were filed during the year ending June 30, 1966, the time between the date notice of appeal was filed in this Court and the date the case was submitted on its merits was as follows: Within three months, 1 case; in three to four months, no cases; in four to six months, 7 cases; in six to eight months, 7 cases; in eight to ten months, 7 cases; in ten to twelve months, 6 cases; and in over twelve months, 6 cases.

In the thirty-nine years that the Clerk of the Supreme Court has furnished us detailed information of the work of the Supreme Court, it has disposed of 16,684 cases, of which 5,645 were dismissed before submission, and 11,039 were submitted on the merits and written opinions filed.
