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Foreword

This issue of the BULLETIN contains a list of court days for 1968 in the various district courts of the state of Kansas.

Both the Kansas Judicial Council and its advisory committee on revision of criminal law have been steadily at work on the project for the past year. The advisory committee on September 1, 1967, concluded its fourth year of work. The Council is in the process of putting its finishing touches on the substantive provisions of the criminal law as recodified. A special BULLETIN should issue early in the year 1968 giving the Bench and Bar sufficient time to study the draft in advance of its submission to the legislature.

The advisory committee on revision of criminal law is at present working on criminal procedure, and in due time a draft of the new law on criminal procedure will be forthcoming from the Council.

The present members of the advisory committee on criminal law revision are the Honorable Doyle E. White of Arkansas City, chairman and member of the Kansas Judicial Council; E. Lael Alkire, Wichita, vice chairman; Selby S. Soward, Goodland; William M. Ferguson, Wellington; Lee V. Hornbaker, Junction City; George T. Van Bebber, Troy; Charles F. Forsyth, Erie; and Paul E. Wilson, Lawrence, reporter. Past members of the committee who resigned by reason of health are A. K. Stavely and Howard E. Payne. Lester M. Goodell of Topeka served on the committee until his death in 1966. J. Richard Foth, Assistant Attorney General, represents the office of the Attorney General in committee deliberations.

At the request of the legal ethics committee of the State Bar Association, the Council in the year 1965 undertook a study of the procedure in handling grievances for lawyers' violations of the Canons of Legal Ethics and the procedure for disciplinary action to be taken in such cases. The advisory committee appointed to assist the Council in this study consisted of James D. Waugh of Topeka, a member of the Council, as chairman; Charles D. Green, Manhattan; Enos Hook, Wichita; James E. Smith, Topeka; Honorable James J. Noone, Wichita; and Morris D. Hildreth, Coffeyville.

In the month of May, 1967, the Council, after study and consideration of the report of the grievance advisory committee, submitted the report to the Supreme Court for consideration in connection with a change in its rules. The Supreme Court has taken the matter under advisement.

During the year 1967 the civil code advisory committee was rejuvenated for the purpose of studying rules in connection with the new code of civil procedure, and making recommendations to the Council for the adoption of new rules by the Supreme Court. As a result of the committee's study several new rules have already been processed through the Judicial Council and submitted to the Supreme Court for adoption.

The members of the civil code advisory committee as presently constituted are the Honorable Alex Hotchkiss of Lyndon, a member of the Kansas Judicial Council, as chairman; Leonard O. Thomas, Kansas City; Emmet A. Blaes, Wichita; Honorable David Prager, Topeka; Marvin E. Thompson, Russell; Morris D. Hildreth, Coffeyville; and the Honorable John F. Fontron, ex officio.

The legislature in its 1967 session referred three additional projects to the Council for study:

(a) Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 25 directs the Council to make a study relating to judicial redistricting and reapportionment; and providing for a report and recommendations thereon to the legislature;

(b) House Concurrent Resolution No. 1008 directs the Council to make a study of the feasibility of establishing a "Hall of Courts" and constructing and equipping a building or buildings for this and other related purposes, including the state law library and educational facilities in the city of Topeka; requiring a report and recommendations thereon to the 1968 session of the legislature; and

(c) House Concurrent Resolution No. 1027 requests the Council to make a study of the adequacies of the law providing for the selection, summoning and procedures of grand juries, and to make a report and recommendations thereon to the 1969 session of the legislature.

The grand jury study was referred to the criminal advisory committee because it had the matter of criminal procedure presently under study.

The Council appointed an advisory committee to assist with the project relating to judicial redistricting and reapportionment. Members of this committee are James E. Taylor of Sharon Springs, a member of the Kansas Judicial Council, as chairman; Whitley Austin, Salina; J. Curtis Nettels, Pittsburg; J. Donald Lysaught, Kansas City; Honorable Page W. Benson, El Dorado; H. L. Sheppeard, Clay Center; Fred L. Conner, Great Bend; and James R. James, the Judicial Administrator, ex officio.

The Hall of Courts project was referred by the Council for study to an advisory committee consisting of Alfred G. Schroeder, of Topeka, chairman and member of the Kansas Judicial Council, as chairman of the committee; J. Willard Haynes, Kansas City, a member of the Council; William Wagner, WaKeeney; Howard G. Engleman, Salina; Joe F. Balch, Chanute, president of the Kansas Bar Association; Robert R. Braden, Wichita; and Jack E. Dalton, Dodge City.

Div. No. 4. July 5 and August 2 and 30.

Note 3. In Bourbon County, July 10 is court day. In Linn County, July 9 is court day. Note 8 is opening day of court term. In Miami County, July 9 is court day. Court convenes at 10:00 a.m. for trials to the Court, and 9:00 a.m. for jury trials.

Note 4. No jury at May term in Dickinson County, and June terms in Geary and Morris Counties, except on special order.

Note 5. In Harvey County, court days are July 11 and 25, and August 1. In McPherson County, court days are July 12 and 26, and August 2.

Note 6. In Sedgewick County, all pre-trial motions in civil cases other than divorce are heard by the Administrative Judge on Friday morning at 9:30 a.m., of the week following the filing of the motion.

All domestic motions are heard at 9:30 a.m. in the respective division, as follows:

All post-trial motions and motions in criminal matters are heard at 2:00 p.m. on the day of the respective divisions' domestic motions.

Note 7. In Barton, Rice and Stafford Counties, court convenes at

10:00 a.m., except when jury appears, when court convenes at 9:00 a.m.; member terms delayed one day a/c New Year holiday and Labor Day. In addition to the regular days of court in Division No. 1, in Riley County, time permitting, special days of court will be held on the third Friday of the month. Also, special days of court in Divisions No. 1 and No. 2 will be scheduled in Clay, Marshall and Riley Counties as the need arises.

Note 8. In Barber, Harper, Kingman and Pratt Counties, court convenes at 10:00 a.m. on court and term days, and at 9:30 a.m. for jury trials. July 8 is term and court day in Barber County.

Note 10. In Wyandotte County, pre-trial and post-trial motions in divorce cases are heard every Friday in the division to which the case is assigned, except that any motion requiring presentation of oral evidence will be specially set by the judge. All other motions are heard in the division to which the case is assigned on the dates indicated above. All motions in criminal cases are heard by the judge in charge of the criminal court by arrangement with him. The criminal court rotates among the various divisions. No regular motion days are designated during the months of July and August; however, each judge will hear his motions at such times as will be fixed by him. All pre-trial motions in divorce cases and emergency matters will be heard each Friday by the judge on duty during these months. All attorneys of record are notified of settings by the assignment clerk.

Note 11. In Jackson, Jefferson and Pottawatomie Counties, time permitting, a special court day will be held in each county two weeks after the regular court days.

Note 12. In Crawford County, July 5 is court day in the Girard Division; and July 1 is court day in the Pittsburg Division.

Note 13. In Grant, Haskell, Morton, Seward, Stanton and Stevens Counties, jury sessions convene at 10:00 a.m. unless otherwise ordered.

Note 14. In Reno County, July 5, 12, 19 and 26, and August 2, 9, 16, 23 and 30 are court days.

Note 15. In Douglas County, July 5 and August 2 are court days, opening at 9:30 a.m. On days on which a term of court opens, the civil docket will be called beginning at 9:30 a.m. and the criminal docket will be called beginning at 2:00 p.m.

Note 16. In Edwards, Hodgesman, Ness, Pawnee and Rush Counties, jury sessions convene at 9:30 a.m. unless otherwise ordered.



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
